July 7 Seventh Sunday after Pentecost

Ezekiel 2:1–5 They will know that a prophet has been among them.

Psalm 123 "To You I lift up my eyes."

2 Corinthians 12:1–10 "My grace is sufficient for you."

Mark 6:1–13 In his hometown a prophet is without honor.

Our human existence is burdened by personal weaknesses and limitations. Paul confesses that he is inflicted with a thorn in the flesh. His only sufficiency is the very grace of God. So also, the prophet Ezekiel is called upon by God as the "son of man." Yet this designation emphasizes Ezekiel's human weakness. Even the disciples embark on their missionary journey without food or possessions. In all circumstances, as God's people we can only boast in His divine grace.

July 14 Eighth Sunday after Pentecost

Amos 7:7–15 The Lord commands Amos, "Go, prophesy to My people Israel."

Psalm 85:(1–7) 8–13 "Surely His salvation is near to those who fear Him." Ephesians 1:3–14 Having believed, you were marked with a seal.

Mark 6:14–29 The death of John the Baptist

God unravels political systems, schemes, and nations, using atypical prophets and preachers. God's chosen messengers attempt to subdue rebellion and call for repentance. Their efforts are met with resistance and fury. Amos, a herdsman and tender of fig trees, prophesies against Israel, but there is no repentance. John the Baptist, the forerunner of Jesus, is unjustly imprisoned and subsequently beheaded. Only through the bloodshed of Jesus is sin completely unraveled and forgiven.

July 21 Ninth Sunday after Pentecost

Jeremiah 23:1–6 "I will gather the remnant of My flock."

Psalm 23 "Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me."

Ephesians 2:11–22 You are fellow citizens with God's people.

Mark 6:30–44 "He had compassion on them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd."

Shepherds are to gather, tend, nourish, and protect flocks. The Lord passes harsh judgment on unfaithful shepherds. Ultimately, it is only Christ, the righteous Branch, who gathers together His flock both from alien Gentile nations as well as chosen Israel. Christ alone provides respite for shepherding disciples, nourishing them with His Word and presence. Furthermore, He miraculously equips faithful shepherds to feed, tend, and nourish those who gather to hear His Word of truth.

July 28 <u>Tenth Sunday after Pentecost</u>

Genesis 9:8–17 God establishes His covenant with Noah.

Psalm 136:1–9 His love endures forever.

Ephesians 3:14–21 That you may know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge.

Mark 6:45–56 Jesus walks on water; Jesus heals the sick.

"Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid." These words of Jesus are precious. At His words, storms cease, fear subsides, disease is eradicated. Christ is able to do far more abundant work than we can comprehend. We are rooted and grounded in His love, which surpasses all boundaries of breadth, length, height, and depth. In all things, Christ is the fulfillment of God's covenant promise through all generations forever and ever.
