**Lord, have mercy, when we cannot gather for Holy Communion**

The Lutheran Church is a Church of Word and Sacrament. We believe that a Sacrament needs specific components to be a sacrament. The first is the command of Jesus that we should observe the Sacrament. The second is specific Word of God consecrates a physical element (water, bread, and wine). Finally the Sacrament actually gives the forgiveness of sins. During this time when we should not gather together in physical groups we do not have access to the Lord's Supper. We can, however, recall with thanksgiving and joy what we are given in the Sacrament of Baptism. Below are the Christian Questions and Answer from Luther's Small Catechism to aid you in this remembrance.

**Question**

*What does Baptism give? What good is it?*

**Answer**

*It gives the forgiveness of sins, redeems from death and the Devil, gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, just as God's words and promises declare.*

**Question**

*What are these words and promises of God?*

**Answer**

*Our Lord Christ spoke one of them in the last chapter of Mark: "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved; but whoever does not believe will be damned."*

**Question**

*How can water do such great things?*

**Answer**

*Water doesn't make these things happen, of course. It is God's Word, which is with and in the water. Because, without God's Word, the water is plain water and not baptism. But with God's Word it is a Baptism, a grace-filled water of life, a bath of new birth in the Holy Spirit, as St. Paul said to Titus in the third chapter: "Through this bath of rebirth and renewal of the Holy Spirit, which He poured out on us abundantly through Jesus Christ, our Savior, that we, justified by the same grace are made heirs according to the hope of eternal life. This is a faithful saying."*

### Question

*What is the meaning of such a water Baptism?*

### Answer

*It means that the old Adam in us should be drowned by daily sorrow and repentance, and die with all sins and evil lusts, and, in turn, a new person daily come forth and rise from death again. He will live forever before God in righteousness and purity.*

*Where is this written?*

### Answer

*St. Paul says to the Romans in chapter six: "We are buried with Christ through Baptism into death, so that, in the same way Christ is risen from the dead by the glory of the Father, thus also must we walk in a new life."*

### Missionary Musings

*A 344% increase.*

*"The Dallas Police Department, which was struggling to recruit officers, has seen a surge in job applications after the ambush shooting this month that killed five officers and brought global attention to the Texas city, officials said on Friday. During the 12 days following the July 7 (2016) shooting, the department said it got 467 job applications, a 344 percent increase compared with the 136 in a similar period in June."*

These are the moments you just have to shake your head in humbleness and declare that God's ways are better than ours, just flat out better. We couldn't even predict this, much less design it. In fact we would probably predict the opposite.

So it is with all events in this world. No matter how much we try, we can't see the negative behind the positive, or the positive behind the "negative" in our view. As Joseph explained to his brothers years after they tried to kill him and he had somehow risen to second in command in Egypt, "As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good" (Genesis 50:20)

All is not as it seems. When discussing whether we are in a time of Christ's rule or Satan's rule according to the Revelation of Jesus Christ that John described, a man said, "If Jesus is ruling now, he sure is giving Satan a lot of leash". Yet our perception is a poor judge of God's status. It was on a cross, where Jesus looked defeated, that he initiated victory. It was in death that he opened the gates of life. It was amidst chaos that the new restoration of creation. What looked like the fast track to defeat was the expressway to victory.

What is God going to do with this? Always a good question, and never one we can predict, or fully realize, this side of eternity. But the question we need to be thinking

most is not, What is God going to do with this. That will happen regardless. The question we need to be pondering is: What are we going to do with this? What will there be a 344% increase of this time, in 2020?

### **'TIL ALL HAVE HEARD MISSION FUNDING CAMPAIGN UPDATE**

As you know, Immanuel proceeded with a divine Call to the Rev. Lucas Witt last October to be Missionary to Baltimore and Immanuel's Associate Pastor. This Call was extended when an overwhelming majority of those attending a Voters Assembly meeting and cast a vote to proceed with this mission strategy here at Immanuel. This Call was also extended with the understanding that a Mission Funding Campaign with the goal to raise a total of \$225,000 would be undertaken to provide funding for this new ministry which was to be outside of our regular church budget. The congregation also approved the plan that any shortfalls in our fundraising efforts would result in utilizing the needed funds from the Endowment Fund.

The timetable for the Campaign was that it would begin in February and be completed with our Pledge Sunday on March 22. This original date was changed when the church's heating system failed in that both the sanctuary and the Fellowship Hall space, which was temporarily not heated, would be needed for specific aspects of the Campaign. A new, revised date for the Mission Funding Campaign was set so that it would kick off on May 3 and conclude by June 14. With the continued restrictions due to the pandemic which means that we cannot gather together, the revised dates of the Campaign of May 3 – June 14 will also not be possible. Plans now are to push back the campaign dates until later this summer or in the fall. .

Please continue to pray for this new ministry here at Immanuel and for Pastor Witt as he leads these missionary efforts. It is important to keep our focus and plans for the support of this ministry that we hope will be a significant piece of our future. In the time prior to the Campaign, gifts to the Missionary Ministry can be made using the special envelopes provide in the envelope boxes. We all look forward to the time that we can again gather for worship and kick off the Mission Funding Campaign so that others can be reached for Christ.
