





READING Acts 2:1–21

was uttered through the prophet Joel:

that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh,

and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy,

and your young men shall see visions,

and your old men shall dream dreams;

¹⁸even on my male servants and female servants

in those days I will pour out my Spirit, and they shall prophesy.

¹⁹And I will show wonders in the heavens above

and signs on the earth below,

blood, and fire, and vapor of smoke;

²⁰the sun shall be turned to darkness


and the moon to blood,

IMPORTANT: Since Baltimore City remains under the Mayor's Stay-at-Home order, Immanuel will not hold services at the building until that order is lifted.

LETTER TO CONGREGATION (Coming in the mail next week)

Dear Brother and Sister Saints of Immanuel -

Grace, mercy, and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ!

As we wait for the "shelter at home" order by the mayor to be lifted from the City of Baltimore, I am overjoyed to tell you of two special opportunities about to begin for Immanuel's people.

The first is the resumption of our Cemetery Services at Immanuel Cemetery, 2809 Grindon Avenue. These Services will begin Sunday, June 7th. They will be held at 8am. There are a few changes that we need to make because of the CORVID-19 pandemic.

First, all services will be held outside. The chapel is to small to allow for social distancing. As a result, the services will be held only when weather permits. If there is a high percent chance of rain for a Sunday morning, the services will be canceled and you will be notified by our Website, immanuellutheran.org, or our Facebook Page.

Second, we ask all in attendance to please wear facemasks. While we will have a few on hand for visitors, it will be most helpful if you bring your own. Even with the mask we ask you to maintain the 6 foot social distancing rules.

Third, we ask you to bring your own chair. While we will have a few available for visitors, any chairs used will need to be sanitized before the next service. It is preferable for you to bring and sanitize your own chairs.

Finally, fourth, we will not serve refreshments after the service as we have been accustomed. This simply is not safe. Our chief concern in all of this is the health and safety of our members and guests.

I am also thrilled to announce that the Sacrament of Holy Communion will be served again in Immanuel's Sanctuary. This will begin on Saturday, June 6th. It will be served several times throughout the day. Again, there are some considerations to be made because of the pandemic.

First, you may attend by appointment only. Groups will be restricted to 8 or less per Sacrament time. Appointments will be on the hour beginning at 10 am and ending at 4:00 pm. We are using the signup.com website to sign up for the various time slots. Please click on https://signup.com/login/entry/1136990759569404037 for the signup sheet. You may also call Laura Higgins at 410-227-5316 (cell) or 443-402-0176 (home) to sign up for a time slot. These brief services are designed to be no more than 20 minutes in length.

Second, you must wear masks when attending. While we will have some on hand, it is helpful for you to bring your own.

Third, the floor and pews will be marked to maintain social distancing.

Fourth, only the individual cups will be available for the wine. Only reception of the host in the hand will be available for the bread.

Fifth, you are to park in the upper lot and enter through the upper doors. Please avoid touching surfaces whenever possible. Hymnals will not be used. Disposable sheets with the Liturgy will be distributed.

Finally, sixth, you are asked not to socialize in the building before or after the service. Again, all these precautions are in place for the protection of our members and staff.
