January 5Second Sunday after Christmas1 Kings 3:4–15Solomon asks the Lord for wisdom.

Psalm 119:97–104 The law of the Lord gives understanding and wisdom.

Ephesians 1:3–14 We are blessed through Christ. **Luke 2:40–52** The boy Jesus in the temple

Only twelve years old, Jesus, the boy in the temple, is already full of the wisdom of God. As Solomon prayed for wisdom as God's greatest gift, today we are given a glimpse into God's wisdom. His wisdom is the greatest and highest wisdom: that a person is not and cannot be saved by his own works or actions, but solely by faith in the gift of Jesus Christ. We become God's children and His own family by God's action of adopting us.

January 6 The Epiphany

Isaiah 60:1–6"Arise, shine, for your light has come."Psalm 72:1–11 (12–15)"All kings fall down before Him."Ephesians 3:1–12"You can perceive my insight."

Matthew 2:1–12 The visit of the Magi

Light eradicates darkness, illuminates creation's glory, and strips away the shroud of mystery. Christ is the light to which all kings and authorities bow down. He makes known the mysteries and salvation of God through the apostles and prophets. The Word and will of the Lord is no longer possessed by a singular people, nor is it cloaked in any kind of ambiguity. All are summoned and blessed to worship Christ. He is our exceeding joy in which our hearts thrill and exult.

January 12 The Baptism of Our Lord

Isaiah 43:1–7 "Fear not, for I have redeemed you." **Psalm 29** "The voice of the Lord is powerful."

Romans 6:1–11 We are united with Christ in His death and resurrection in Baptism.

Luke 3:15–22 John baptizes Jesus in the Jordan.

Baptism in Christ carefully balances the terror of death and the exhilaration of resurrection. Sin is dismantled, disarmed, and destroyed. The sinner, engrafted now to Christ, becomes a new creation, baptized and resurrected like Jesus, alive to God and claimed by Him forever. The realm of death cannot possess the life of a believer. John boldly engages in this ministry of proclamation and divine action. Even Jesus submits to Baptism, receiving the declaration of His Father, "You are My beloved Son."

January 19 Second Sunday after Epiphany

62:1–5 The nations will see Your righteousness, and all kings Your glory.

Psalm 128 "Blessed is everyone who fears the Lord."

1 Corinthians 12:1–11 There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit.

John 2:1–11 Jesus' miracle at the wedding of Cana

Jesus manifests His glory at the wedding feast at Cana, changing ordinary water into exquisite wine. The church treasures this divine action of Christ, remembering, believing, and receiving forgiveness in Jesus' divine blood, in, under, and with ordinary wine. God in Christ binds Himself to His people, from desolate forsaken Israel to the holy church of today. She is the Bride, and He the Bridegroom, whose resolute faithfulness seals the marriage covenant with us forever.

January 26 Third Sunday after Epiphany

Nehemiah 8:1–3, 5–6, 8–10 Ezra reads the Law to the people.

Psalm 19:(1–6) 7–14 "The Law of the Lord is perfect."

1 Corinthians 12:12–31a We are all a part of the Body of Christ.

Luke 4:16–30 Jesus preaches in the synagogue. "Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing."

Only Jesus sufficiently comprehends and delivers the counsels of God in the purity of the Law and the grace of the Gospel. Work Has Begun on LCEF "Best Uses" Initiative

During a special Voter's Assembly Meeting that took place on November 24, the congregation voted to accept a proposal from the Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF) that identifies LCEF Real Estate Solutions as a ministry partner who will explore the possibilities of utilizing real estate assets to further ministry, meet community needs, and create an alternate source of revenue. The spirit of this resolution is that LCEF will affirm the ministry heart of our congregation and act as a consultant to explore campus concepts related to real estate while always representing our best interests.

Specifically, LCEF is looking to identify and implement a strategy that would be based on "best uses" of the vacant land bordering Loch Raven Blvd and / or unused portions of our building. The concept here is that a portion of our land and/or building could be used to house an entity that would provide a regular and ongoing source of income that would be added to the church budget desired outcomes so that Immanuel can continue its ministry at Loch Raven and Belvedere.

Work has now begun in this area and an initial report will be provided at the January 19 Voters Assembly Meeting.
