November 1 All Saints Day

Revelation 7:(2–8) 9–17 The great multitude in white robes "The Lord takes pleasure in His people."

1 John 3:1–3 How great is the love the Father has lavished on us!

Matthew 5:1–12 The Beatitudes

The confession resounds in every time and place by all believing peoples, tribes, and churches: "Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!" These words emanate from faith-filled saints who belong to Jesus. In His eternal presence, the beloved saints are utterly content in endless service and worship. Saints are the ones forever blessed, comforted, satisfied, and rewarded, because their inheritance is the very kingdom of God.

November 3 Twenty-fourth Sunday after Pentecost

Deuteronomy 6:1–9 The greatest commandment

Psalm 119:1–8 "Blessed are they whose way is blameless."

Hebrews 9:11–14 (15–22) We are redeemed through the blood of Christ.

Mark 12:28–37 The Great Commandment

Commandments proceed from the authority of God. He bids Israel to love the Lord God with heart, soul, and mind and to impress this commandment on succeeding generations. Jesus, our great High Priest, reiterates this command before scribes and reveals its greater meaning. Love the Lord with heart, soul, and mind, and love your neighbor as yourself. This comprehensive God-given love, revealed in Christ Jesus, sustains our relationship with Him and with one another.

November 10 Twenty-fifth Sunday after Pentecost 1 Kings 17:8–16 Elijah and the widow of Zarephath

Psalm 146 The Lord upholds the widow and the fatherless.

Hebrews 9:24–28 Christ will appear a second time.

Mark 12:38–44 The widow's mite

God sustains life through simple, meager gifts. For Elijah, a widow, and her son, life is sustained through a scant portion of flour and water. Another widow's incidental coins, given out of poverty, are heralded as more valuable than sums of money given out of wealth. God discerns righteous things that proceed from the heart. He also judges heartless pretense and arrogance. Beneath the canopy of God's care for us in Christ, His Law condemns and His Gospel redeems.

November 17 <u>Twenty-sixth Sunday after Pentecost</u>

Daniel 12:1–3 Everyone's name in the book of life will be delivered.

Psalm 16 You will not abandon me to the grave. **Hebrews 10:11–25** Their sins I will remember no more.

Mark 13:1–13 He who stands firm to the end will be saved.

God's people endure significant hardship. God intervenes, providing protection, sacrifice, and courage. He commands the archangel Michael to care for Israel. Christ, the great High Priest, offers Himself as the pure sacrifice for all sins. Therefore, our heavenly Father graciously remembers our rebellious sins and lawless deeds no more. What comfort as we are propelled toward the Day of Judgment—a day marked by persecution, war, famine, and earthquakes! And yet, in the midst of these hardships, faith endures.

The revelation of a new heaven and earth will be dramatic in the tumultuous last days. But God's salvation will prevail, lasting forever, through the reign of the Alpha and Omega—Jesus Christ, our Lord. He alone will judge with equity and truth, righteousness and grace. Ministry Notes

Consecration Sunday

During the worship service on Sunday, October 27, those present were asked to bring forward their pledge of financial support to be provided in 2025. This year's Consecration Sunday was celebrated in the context of continuing ministry within the fivefold function of the church: Worship, Education, Fellowship, Service, and Evangelism, and also reacting to the recent financial challenges and reliance on deficit budgets that now threaten the long term viability of the congregation.

We rejoice in the fact that a total of 32 pledges for \$132,848 were received on or before Consecration Sunday. Thanks to everyone for their participation and generosity. This compares favorably to last year when a

total of 36 pledges for \$126,376 was the total number and amount received. It is anticipated that additional pledges will be added by the end of the year that will further increase the dollars pledged.

Special Voter's Assembly Scheduled

A special Voter's Assembly has been scheduled for **Sunday, November 24 immediately following the 10 AM worship service.** This meeting has been scheduled to present two resolutions to the congregation.

Resolution to Engage the Lutheran Church Extension Fund to Explore "Best Uses" of Real Estate

The first resolution to be considered comes from the **Building on Christ Equipping for the Future** team that is looking to identify and implement a strategy that would determine "best uses" of the vacant land bordering Loch Raven Blvd and / or portions of our building. The resolution will request approval to accept a proposal from the Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF) that identifies LCEF as Immanuel's ministry partner who will explore the possibilities of utilizing real estate assets to further ministry, meet community needs, and create an alternate source of revenue. Keeping in mind the ministry heart of our congregation, LCEF will act as a consultant to initially explore campus concepts as it relates to real estate while always representing our best interests.

Through the acceptance of the proposal, Immanuel is inviting LCEF Real Estate Solutions to explore a partnership that is likely to include a for-profit real estate developer that is a good fit with Immanuel's vision and involve industry experts as sub consultants who will be contracted and paid by LCEF. The initial phase of the work will provide site and community needs and identify potential deal structures that would allow ministry to continue on the existing site while creating an alternate source of revenue for Immanuel.

The Church Council has reviewed the proposal and unanimously recommends approval.
